SUCCESSSES and CHALLENGES



LITERACY FOCUS

- Implementation of “3T” testing for literacy - significant improvement observed across grade levels
- Effective use of “UFLI” program in K-3 Language Arts instruction
- Daily reading block - included cross grade reading partners, sustained silent reading, and guest readers
- Effective use of “Rewards” program in higher grade levels students as a reading intervention
- Supporting striving readers remains key area for improvement

SUCSESSES and CHALLENGES

NUMERACY FOCUS

- Successful transition into new K-6 mathematics curriculum
- Professional development sessions - building common assessments for grade 7 and 8 math
- Ongoing site-based professional conversations regarding best practices in mathematics instruction
- Pilot of Elk Island Catholic School math assessment
- Supporting the implementation of new K-6 math has been a challenge in the midst of new K-6 Language Arts curriculum and in the context of multi-graded classrooms



SUCCESSSES and CHALLENGES

STUDENT ENGAGEMENT FOCUS

- CTS Home economics program provided for 4-9 students
- Participated in the Artist in Residence Program with Trickster Theatre
- CTS Shop program for 7-9 students in partnership with Coronation School
- Outdoor Education provided for students in grades 4-9
- Staff focused on increasing hands-on and total participation activities as part of planning processes
- With a small staff team we need to continue to look for opportunities to provide unique learning experiences for our students

LITERACY

GOAL: Increased Literacy Skills Among All Students

KEY MEASURES: 3T Literacy Testing Results, Provincial Test Results

STRATEGIES:

- 1) Explicit literacy instruction supported by “UFLI” program in K-3
- 2) Interventions, such as the “Rewards” program, for striving readers
- 3) Daily Reading blocks - opportunity for peer to peer reading, guest readers, and staff intervention reading with striving readers



NUMERACY

GOAL: Increased Math Proficiency Among All Students

KEY MEASURES: EICS Fall Assessments, Provincial Numeracy Screener and PATs

STRATEGIES:

- 1) Site-based professional development - planning for multi-grade math instruction, focus on increasing hands-on and total participation activities as part of planning processes
- 2) Division led professional development - collaborative planning sessions with math teachers from across Clearview Public Schools
- 3) Administrator observations and professional conversations with math teachers



STUDENT ENGAGEMENT



GOAL: Increased Engagement of All Students in All Aspects of School Life

KEY MEASURE: Assurance Survey Results

STRATEGIES:

- 1) Increase administrator's instructional leadership time
- 2) Continue to support Home Economics, Career Technology Foundations, Career Technology Studies (Shop), and Outdoor Ed.
- 3) Foster community involvement to enhance learning opportunities for all students
