Grade 1/2/3 Update

The grade 1, 2 and 3 classes were VERY excited about the snow this morning. Our purpose was to persuade people (especially Miss Tracy) why the snow is great. We started pre-writing today and will work a little bit each day until we get a few sentences or a paragraph depending on the grade level of the student. All 3 classes are quite confident with nouns, so we will continue to build on that knowledge and move on to verbs. U.F.L.I. is going well, reading is going well, fluency and comprehension are being built on with the grade 2 and 3 classes and introduced to the grade 1 class. In math the grade 1 class is writing equations with adding numbers to 5 and the grade 2 class is making bar graphs of their own. Today in math the grade 1 and 2 class made their own Splats! They are in the hallway at school if you would like to see if you can figure out the missing number. In science we are discussing matter and what matter can be made of and in social studies we are learning the Canadian provinces, territories and capital cities. We are learning, growing and having fun!
