Student Absences

Please send a note to school if your child will be absent, arrive late, or if you would like to pick up your child before the end of the school day. Please call the school (403-578-2247) after 8:15 AM to inform us of an unplanned student absence, such as illness. The office will contact families of students who are absent without permission each morning. **Regular and punctual attendance is essential to a student's progress at school and to their personal development.** The Province of Alberta School Act requires that all students attend school regularly and punctually.

Family Holidays Taken While School is in Session

Students spend the majority of their time in school learning through discussion and other hands-on activities. This change from years past makes it difficult to send homework to children while they are on vacation. For this reason, **we will not send work before a family vacation for students in K-6**, but we encourage you to consider travel time as a learning opportunity for your children. Students in grades 7-9 should make arrangements with their subject area teachers. When you return from vacation, classroom teachers will work with students on missed learning objectives at school and support families to help their children catch up on missed work at home.

School Council and Foundation

Brownfield Community School is fortunate to have two exceptional groups of parents who participate in the School Council and School Foundation.

Brownfield School Council members offer input and assist the principal on educational matters. School Council Meetings are held five times a year, on Mondays at 7:00 PM.

Brownfield Community School Foundation is involved in raising and allocating funds for special projects. School Foundation Meetings are held on the same evening as council meetings, at 6 PM.

Serving on these committees is an excellent opportunity for parents to work with the school to support and enhance student learning effectively.

Lunch Programs

Tuesdays - Healthy Lunch

Brownfield Community School receives money each year through the School Nutrition Grant. We supply a Healthy Lunch on most Tuesdays throughout the school year at no cost to families. Order forms are sent out quarterly, and families can select the lunches they prefer.

Thursdays - Hot Lunch

Our Junior High Parents have provided a hot lunch option for students on most Thursdays throughout the school year. **This program is a fundraiser.** The proceeds support student activities, such as sports tournament entry fees. Order forms are also sent out quarterly, and families can choose to participate.

Extra-curricular and co-curricular activities can positively impact students' learning, social development and enjoyment at school.

Field Trips

Field trips supplement classroom experiences. Information will be sent home before each field trip, and you will be asked to sign a permission slip. It is a district expectation that this slip be signed before your child can leave the site. Please ensure the permission slip is signed and returned to your child's teacher by the due date to avoid disappointment. Parental involvement is encouraged on field trips as requested.

Drama

Our School hosts a Christmas Concert and a Spring Concert each year. At these events, students participate in musical and dramatic performances. We have also secured grants to support drama groups visiting Brownfield in the past.

Student Behaviour

Under the Alberta School Act (section 7), students are expected to conduct themselves to comply with the following code of conduct:

- be diligent in pursuing their studies
- attend school regularly and punctually
- cooperate fully with everyone authorized by the Board to provide education programs and other services
- comply with the rules of the school
- respect the rights of others.

Bus Behaviour

Riding the bus is a privilege, not a right. We expect students to follow these guidelines. Please do so to avoid having your bus privileges removed.

- Sit properly and quietly in your seat, facing the front while the bus is in motion.
- Always promptly obey directions given by the school bus driver.
- Be properly dressed for the weather.
- Be at your pick-up point on time.

Personal Property

The safekeeping of personal property rests with our students. Therefore, they cannot bring toys and/or electronic equipment.

We request that lunch kits and all outer clothing items, including footwear, be identified with your child's name. We have a lost and found box located near the front entryway. Unclaimed items from the lost and found are donated twice a year (December and June) to a recognized charity.

Cell Phones

Cell phones are prohibited for students in Kindergarten to Grade 6. Junior High students may use cell phones before, during lunch and after school. Cell phones are not permitted in classrooms and washrooms. During class time, cell phones must be placed in lockers. The school and its staff are not responsible for any damage to or theft of a student's cellphone. Therefore, students must properly secure and take care of their phones. If students need to make an emergency phone call during class, they should request permission to go to the main office to use the office phone.

Student Dress Code

Students are expected to dress in clothing that is appropriate for school. Students will be addressed on a case-by-case basis if there are any concerns with their clothing.

- Clothing that promotes or brings awareness to hate, persecution, intolerance of others, unhealthy lifestyles, etc., is not allowed at school.
- Students are expected to have two sets of shoes at school. One pair is to be worn inside, while the other is to be worn outside only.
- Students in grades 4-9 are expected to change for gym classes.

Safe and Caring School

Brownfield Community School is proud of its reputation as a safe and caring school. Staff and students must respect themselves, respect each other, and respect property. We ask that you help us maintain our safe and caring school by following procedures and policies.

Locked Outside Doors & Sign-In Sheet

During the school day, all outside doors are locked. There is a doorbell at the main entrance. Parents and guests are welcome during the school day; however, we kindly request that you use the main door so we can keep track of who is in the building at all times. All visitors to our school are required to sign in at the reception desk. The sign-in sheet is located at the office. Please provide your name and the date and time of your arrival. Please sign out when you exit the school, providing the departure time.

Student Health

Families and the school must maintain clear and open communication regarding student health. When students are at school, please inform the school staff of any health-related concerns so that they can provide adequate care and supervision.

Allergy Aware

We allow nuts at Brownfield Community School. However, we have classrooms that may have specific guidelines due to the presence of children with allergies in those classes. Please speak with your child about not sharing their food with other children. There may be times when we need to send notice home about other severe allergies, and we will require the support of families.

Medication

There are times when parents need the help of school staff with administering medications to their children. When this happens, please ask office staff for a [Parental Request for Ongoing Student Health Support](#) form to begin the process.

Lice

Lice are an unfortunate part of life at school. They can impact anyone. Our practice for dealing with lice at school is as follows: teachers will send students they suspect of having lice to the office, where office staff will inspect their hair. Parents will be notified if we find lice, and will pick their children up from the school and keep them home until their hair has been treated. Quick attention to this issue helps reduce the spread of lice.

Cold Weather

Please ensure that your child is appropriately dressed for the weather. They are expected to go outside during recess, and we want them to be comfortable at that time. Students may be asked to stay in the classrooms during recess when we are experiencing extremely cold conditions. It may be a good idea to have an extra pair of pants and socks in the locker or student backpack during periods of wet weather.

School Closure - Extreme Weather

In extreme weather conditions, buses may be cancelled for the day. Please see the attached reference document for details regarding these situations.

Student Assessment

Collecting evidence related to a student's learning is known as assessment. It consists of the teacher's professional judgment, informed by observations, conversations, products, and student reflection on progress. Classroom assessment is broad-based, encompassing various evidence gathered over time through multiple assessment methods. While student learning is measured by learner outcomes from the Alberta Program of Studies, some programs are adapted or modified in one or more subjects to meet their individual learning needs. The school will issue report cards three times a year, which will include teacher comments and achievement levels, as described below. Each report card reflects student learning for that particular reporting period. Information regarding attendance, behaviour, effort, participation, attitude, and other factors is collected, recorded, and communicated separately from achievement-based evidence.

Report Card and Interview Dates

Report cards are issued three times during the school year. Parent-teacher interviews are scheduled in conjunction with the first and second reports.
